Students spend more than 75% of school time doing intense, visual work less than a foot from their eyes.

Vision is often an overlooked component of learning and reading problems. August was declared Vision & Learning Month in 1995 with a proclamation from President Bill Clinton. The goal of this national observance is to help educate parents and school professionals about the critical link between vision and learning.

Vision Stats:

1 in 10 children has a vision problem significant enough to impact learning.

"20/20" only means a child can see at a distance but may **lack skills needed for learning,** such as eye tracking, coordinating, and focusing.

Typical vision screenings can miss **at least 50%** of vision problems.
